



Stronger Evangelism: “Seeking the Lost”

Core Texts: Romans 10:14–15; Luke 15

Opening Thought: God’s mission is both proclamation (Romans 10) and pursuit (Luke 15). We are called not just to speak—but to seek.

1. In Romans 10:14–15, what is the sequence Paul lays out for someone coming to faith? Which step stands out to you most and why?
2. How does understanding that “preach” means to proclaim or announce (not just a sermon) change how you view evangelism?
3. In Luke 15, what do all three parables reveal about God’s character?
4. Why does Jesus emphasize one lost sheep, one lost coin, and one lost son?
5. Which story in Luke 15 do you relate to most right now—and why?
6. Who is someone in your life who might be far from God? What might it look like to notice them more intentionally this week?
7. How does knowing you might be planting or watering (not finishing the process) change your mindset?
8. What is one small step you can take this week to share, invite, or start a conversation?

Closing Prayer: Pray for specific people by name. Ask God for boldness, awareness, and opportunities.

Final Thought: We don’t just wait for the lost to come—we join God in going after them.
